Information for Faculty to Be Interprofessional Educators

There are multiple resources available for Sim-IPE. One example is the NLN toolkit (Speakman, Tagliareni, Sherburne, & Sicks, 2016) that may be helpful for any discipline considering IPE. The University of Washington Center for Health Sciences Interprofessional Education Research and Practice (n.d.-a, n.d.-b) provides resources for IPE activities, toolkits, and training opportunities for clinical faculty interested in developing Sim-IPE, along with other resources listed in Table 10-3. The Council of Academic Programs in Communication Sciences and Disorders (CAPCSD; 2018) created a task force to determine current best practices in simulations in communication sciences and disorders. The final guide noted that an important first step in getting started with Sim-IPE is to identify the desired student learning outcomes that are specific to each profession and to promote communication, professionalism, and teamwork among the professions (CAPCSD, 2018).
