<b>Becoming and Peace</b>	<p><b>Positive</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Peaceful environment /personal, communal or national circumstances encourage continuance of occupational interests</li> <li>• Lack of conflict enables occupational growth and development</li> </ul> <p><b>Negative</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Inter-personal, communal or national conflict prevents, inhibits, or discourages continuance of occupational interests</li> <li>• War prevents occupational growth and development</li> </ul>
<b>Becoming and Shelter</b>	<p><b>Positive</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Shelter appropriate for occupation requirements and aspirations</li> <li>• Accessible to prerequisites needed to meet potential/interests</li> <li>• Sociocultural support for shelter suitable for everyone to become</li> </ul> <p><b>Negative</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Shelter inappropriate for occupation requirements and aspirations</li> <li>• Not accessible to prerequisites needed to meet potential/interests</li> <li>• Little or no support for suitable shelters</li> <li>• Large populations of refugees remain in camps with limited opportunities to improve their lives. In</li> <li>• 2009, 42 million people had been displaced by conflict or persecution particularly in developing countries.<sup>92b</sup></li> </ul>
<b>Becoming and Education</b>	<p><b>Positive</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• The same range of education available to all people regardless of age, gender, race, social standing,</li> <li>• cultural or religious norms</li> <li>• Development /access to education for varied occupational needs</li> </ul> <p><b>Negative</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Education not available to all people</li> <li>• Restricted or no access to education</li> <li>• Lack of education to meet for different occupational needs</li> <li>• "In the world 130 million children do not have a primary education of that 130 million two thirds of them are females"<sup>92c</sup></li> </ul>
